My academic position is Associate Professor in Caring Sciences at Mälardalen University.

Professional background

I am registered nurse and a qualified nurse teacher with a Master's degree from The Stockholm Institute of Education. After a period as an Education Supervisor and clinical lecturer at Mälardalen hospital I started my Postgraduate studies at the Institute of Health Care Education, Gothenburg's University. After graduation I have been working as a senior lecturer and later as associate professor at School of Health care and Social Welfare, Mälardalen University.

Academic background

I was got my Master in Education in 1996, PhD in 2002 and became Associate Professor in 2008. My thesis is entitled Eriksson, H. (2002) *The diplomatic point – masculinity as an Embodied Identity project in Swedish Nursing Education*. Faculty of Education, Institute of Health Care Education, Gothenburg's University.

I have published app. 20 papers in reviewed international journals and about 20 other papers and abstracts for international conferences. I am the main or contributing author to seven different book titles and I am supervisor or co-supervisor in four different doctoral projects. Currently I am working on eight articles and research papers that are in manuscript, submitted and under consideration for publication. I am a specialist in qualitative methods and have a broad knowledge in discourse analysis, ethnography and nethnography, critical incident technique and all kinds of qualitative content analysis.

Main research interests

My special interest is to research how caring practices creates (or can create) embodied "gender vertigo" experiences that diverse and deconstructs masculinities as we know them today, what we call hegemonic masculinity. So therefore, even if I am well rounded in feminist theory and gender research overall, with a special interest in poststructuralistic perspectives launched by i.e. Donna Haroway. I would

say that my area of expertise for the moment is in the field of Critical Studies of Men and Masculinities combined with the knowledge from Nursing and Caring disciplines. But as I said, I am currently working with a broad understanding of gender and feminist theory in my different projects, my own as well as my doctoral students.

My academic position is Senior Lecturer in Caring Sciences at Mälardalen University.

Professional background

I am registered nurse and a qualified nurse teacher with a Master's degree from Mälardalen University in nursing. After a period as a lecturer I started my Postgraduate studies in gerontological caring (elderly nursing) at the Karolinska Institute in Stockholm, Neurotec Institute, Unit for Gerontological Caring Sciences.

After graduation I have been working as a senior lecturer and at School of Health care and Social Welfare, Mälardalen University and part time as a project leader in the social contract.

Academic background

I got my Master in nursing in 2000, PhD in 2009. My thesis is entitled Gustafsson, C. (2009) Nursing at distance, Community nursing in municipal elderly care.

I have published six papers in peer reviewed international journals and about 10 other papers and abstracts for international conferences. Currently I am working on five articles and research papers that are in manuscript, submitted and under consideration for publication. I am a specialist in qualitative methods and have a broad knowledge in phenomenography, phenomenological hermeneutics and qualitative content analysis.

Main research interests

My special interest is about elderly nursing (community nursing) with a special focus on technology and how the technology integrates the daily life. I am very involved at the Mälardalen University interdisciplinary research program "Technologies for independent life". One research project is about elderly and disabled and ICT (information communication technology) with a special focus on the users' experiences, the concept of users includes patients, relatives as well as staffs.

Another project is about a RoboCat constructed for elderly with dementia in a late stage. In a cooperation project with researchers in robotics we have created a robotic cat. Five prototypes of the cat will be clinical tested in February 2012.
